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

Directive on patients' rights in cross-border care

- Upcoming implementing act on prescriptions: minimum data to be shared across borders,
 - Article 11
 - Paving the way to ePrescription

eHealth Network under the Cross- Border Healthcare Directive

- Legal basis: Article 14 of Directive 2011/24
 - Cooperation and the exchange of information among Member States
 - A voluntary network connecting national authorities responsible for eHealth
- Tasks: specified in Articles 11 and Article 14
 - Guidelines


eHealth Network's Priorities 2012-2014

4. Defining a set of data of patient's summary record to be exchanged cross-border

5.Interoperability guidelines on ePrescriptions

- Implementing act on prescriptions: minimum data for crossborder prescriptions, art 11 of the Directive 2011/24/EU - to pave the way to ePrescription
- Interoperability between European and national databases for medicinal products (use of the IDMP standards)







eHealth Action Plan 2012-2014

Objectives include:

- Wider interoperability of eHealth services
- Support research, development and innovation in eHealth and wellbeing
- Address the lack of availability of user-friendly tools and services
- Uptake and ensuring wider deployment
- International cooperation

Major role for the eHealth Network foreseen

Time scale: 2012-2020





Connecting Europe Facility: Scaling up Interoperable eHealth Services

- CEF Regulation: A common infrastructure fund to deploy smart interconnected transport, energy and digital networks
- Combines market based instruments and EU direct support to optimise the impact of financing
- Total budget: [€50] billion
 - ICT [€9,2] billion (broadband & electronic services for the public)
- CEF could support implementation of large scale crossborder eHealth services and connecting infrastructures
- Timing: 2014-2020
- CEF governance the eHealth Network will be consulted





EU multi stakeholder platform for **ICT** standardisation

- A structure set up under the proposed Regulation on European Standardisation
 - Dialogue between Commission, Member States, all stakeholders, standard setting organisations
- Objective: Evaluation and Identification of technical specifications for interoperability
- The technical specifications can be used by Member States in public procurement
- EC and Member States can suggest specifications and profiles for evaluation to the Platform
- The eHealth Network could suggest specifications for evaluation and promote the use of identified specifications
